

What Degree Can I Get?

"The Snow College Dance Department offers a curriculum designed for all students, those wanting to learn dance for the first time, those wanting to continue their dance training for fun and recreational experience and dance majors. For dance majors, the department provides the technical foundation for the first two years of college study. Emphasis is placed on teaching the fundamentals of dance: ballet, modern dance, jazz, tap, hip hop, social dance, yoga and performance, as well as development of creative skills and exploration of dance theory."



What Classes Should I Take?

A student who has chosen a transfer institution should check prerequisites unique to that institution. Students are required to take a placement audition at the new institution, which will determine the transferability of credits. Therefore it is wise for students to take as much dance technique as possible at Snow College to increase the chances for a successful audition.
