

TILT Research Tutorial Instructions

In preparation for continued research for English 2010, you will do a library Internet tutorial. The tutorial is designed to help you understand how to begin research, how to do research, how to decide what is and is not a good source, and how to properly keep track of the sources that you discover.

The TILT program includes an introduction and three modules; each is focused on a specific aspect of research. The assignment for this course is to go through the tutorial program on the Internet and complete the quiz for each module. You can repeat the modules and the quizzes as many times as you like between now and the due date. You need to turn in the quiz for each module by sending it to me by e mail <erick.faatz@snow.edu> or by bringing a printed copy to me. More specific instructions follow.

1. Go to the Snow College Library home page <www.snow.edu/>. There are links from the Writing Lab (Humanities 149) home page and from the Snow College home page.
2. Choose “Library Tutorial” to the right-hand side of the library home page.
3. Use “Full TILT” or “TILT lite” depending on the capabilities of the computer that you are using. (You can download free plug-ins to your personal computer if needed.)
4. At the bottom of the page, choose “and enter TILT.”
5. Register as a “First Time Visitor” on your first visit. Register as a “Return Visitor” on subsequent visits to the site.
6. Choose a topic from the “Current Internet Issues” page. Choose “Choose It” at the bottom of the page.
7. Choose the “Introduction” icon. Follow the written instructions and read each section as indicated.
8. Take one half hour to forty-five minutes to read through each of the three modules. Take the quiz at the end of each module, and send the results to me by e-mail <erick.faatz@snow.edu> or bring a copy of the printed results to me. You may retake the quizzes for higher scores as many times as you like before the due date.
