Community Partner: Dead Horse Point State Park is located approximately 3½ hours southeast of Ephraim, UT (less than an hour's drive from Moab). Two days of the trip will entail service projects within the park, building and restoring trails, habitat, and other work as determined by our partners in the park. We will also take time to hike, backpack, visit, explore, and learn about other areas near the park (Arches NP, Canyonlands NP, Moab, etc. as determined by group interest.)

Alternative Spring Break (ASB) Participant Expectations:

- Attend any pre-departure meetings, and other trip activities and trainings. (There will probably be at least 2 of these short meetings. We'll contact you with details.)
- Complete packet of assigned readings (regional background, history, and service learning overview—roughly 40 pages) prior to trip. This will be distributed at our first pre-trip meeting.
- Be able to provide proof of medical insurance prior to departure. If you do not have health insurance, short-term trip insurance may be available.
- Be financially responsible for any incidental personal expenses incurred during the trip (you know, like souvenirs and things).
- Participate in all trip activities, including work/service projects, any team-building exercises, and other activities as reasonably determined by group and leaders.
- Abide by all Snow College policies and procedures as they apply to the ASB experience.
- Remain alcohol and drug-free from date of departure until time of return.
