Through the preparation and performance of quality band literature, students enrolled in this course will develop an understanding and appreciation of the various styles of wind literature. This group serves all students who wish to play, regardless of technical facility. Because all 4-year transfer schools in the state offer a similar experience, Snow College ensemble credit transfers without difficulty.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Students will demonstrate an understanding of the literature selected by the instructor through accurate and expressive performance.

Content:

Music from all periods of legitimate band repertoire will be studied, practiced, rehearsed and performed. Proper instrumental technique will be stressed.

Students will demonstrate through performance an understanding of the musical practices of different world cultures as expressed in contemporary wind ensemble literature. Students will also demonstrate through performance, an understanding of the musical practices of different historical periods.
