Justification:

As technology and travel progress, the world is becoming a smaller and smaller place. The opportunity to develop intercultural understanding and global awareness should be available to all students at Snow College. This course offers an excellent opportunity to build international awareness and intercultural understanding while providing a nurturing environment for students to have meaningful experiences of cultural awareness. This course is required for the Teaching Second and Foreign Languages emphasis.

Student Learning Outcomes:

1. Students will have increased their understanding of diversity, new cultures, and ideas that are different from their own.
2. Students will have an increased awareness and respect for others' religious, political beliefs and social beliefs.

Content:

Partners will participate in activities that are approved by the instructor. Activities such as Snow College sporting events, convocations, plays, movies, dances, recitals, concerts, and political meetings are all acceptable activities. Written responses are required for each activity. Students will demonstrate their critical consideration of the experiences by addressing a variety of areas such as communication breakdown, cultural variations, learning experiences, and differences. Students will have a new partner each session.

Students will share their own culture with others as they learn about new cultures. In the process, students will learn about themselves and others, increasing their inter-cultural knowledge and awareness.
