#### **File Description**

The Students Data Submission File contains demographic records for all the students for a particular extract. It is submitted five times per fiscal year (Summer EOT, Fall 3<sup>rd</sup> Week, Fall EOT, Spring 3<sup>rd</sup> Week, and Spring EOT).

#### **Capture Date**

The capture date for each 3<sup>rd</sup>-Week extract is the 3<sup>rd</sup>-Week date of the Semester. The capture date for each EOT is the end of the respective term.

The Banner source information came from <u>Salt Lake Community College Finding IMC Data Extract Files in Banner</u> by Bob Rantz. This document was presented at the Utah Information Management Committee (IMC) meeting on June 3, 2003.

#### **Submission File Usage**

The Students Data Submission File is used for reporting of Student Headcount, Performance Evaluations, Data Book, Workforce Services Economic Indicators, TRIO program tracking, student tracking, and others as necessary.

#### **Delimiter**

The Students Data Submission File must be submitted in a pipe delimited format. A single pipe symbol '|' will be used as the delimiter. When submitting a delimited file, the pipe symbol must appear between each field in the file (Note: some data elements will have multiple fields, e.g. ethnicity has 8 fields).
